other schools. And for us, Cincinnati State ITP stepped in. Thanks in part to Dawn Caudill (*left*) we were able to move the Fair to their facilities at no charge. God says, "I know the plans that I have for you."

Before the Corona Virus hit, we made plans for the All About Deaf Kids Fair which God blessed in spite of changing locations. About 250 people participated in this event. **Ash Huston**, our new parttime teen leader, was part of that group. *(pictured, next column, leading the "Elephant Game.")*

Since Covid-19, Ash has continued his work, but we had to rethink plans of how to reach these Greater Cincinnati Deaf Teens. Ash is still reaching out and has started an online Bible study fellowship for deaf teens. *(see Ash's update on Page 3.)*

Corona has affected us in a lot of ways. VBS for Deaf Kids, Deaf & Family & Friends Camp and Lake James School of Missions all had to be cancelled for 2020. There were also other closures and changes. Church buildings have

closed, camps have had to reschedule or cancel activities. Some mission buildings have closed and some missionaries have been



pulled from the harvest fields. But God knew all this ahead of time and His work continues.

Did you know Pam and I are both 69? At the recommendation of our doctors, our children and our board, we have agreed to reduce our work hours. This will allow us to keep serving while we train new leaders and plan for the future of the mission. Wait a minute! **Did I just** say "plan?" Yes, I did, but as usual with the understanding that "God willing" the things we are planning will happen. And if not? That's OK too. Jeremiah 29:11 says, "I say this because I know the plans that I have for you." God knows our hearts and He also knows what's best for us. We are trusting Him to lead us.
